

## Arts & Sciences Categories

### Art

- Calligraphy & Illumination: Decorative lettering or manuscript-style art.
- Charcoal & Pastels: Shading and color blending with dry media.
- Mixed Media (2D): Combining hand-done techniques (e.g., ink and watercolor).
- Model Painting: Hand-painting miniatures, figurines, or terrain pieces.
- Painting: Oils, acrylics, watercolors, or tempera.
- Penciling & Inking: Sketches, line art, or detailed illustrations.

*Digital art, animation, or digitally assisted art is not permissible in this category and must be entered into the Storytelling category.*

### Bardic

- Chant & Recitation: Spoken word performances, such as period poetry, dramatic monologues, or oratory.
- Comedy: Live performances of humorous monologues,

sketches, or period-appropriate stand-up.

- Instrumental Performance: Live playing of historical or fantasy-inspired instruments.
- Singing & Vocal Performance: Solo or group singing of original or traditional songs.
- Theatrical Performance: Skits, dramatic scenes, or comedic acts.
- Improvisational Bardic: On-the-spot creation of songs, poems, or tales based on audience prompts.
- Mixed Bardic Performance: Combination of singing, oration, and instrumental play in a single act.

*Pre-recorded or digitally enhanced items are not permissible in this category and must be entered into the Storytelling category.*

## Brews & Spirits

- Beer & Ale: Homebrewed or period-inspired beer, ales, or meads.
- Liquor & Spirits: Distilled spirits, including whiskey, rum, gin, and flavored infusions.
- Cider & Perry: Fermented apple or pear-based beverages.
- Tea & Herbal Infusions: Brewed teas, tisanes, or herbal infusions.
- Coffee & Coffee-Based Drinks: Brewed coffee, espresso, or coffee-based beverages.
- Recipe Creation & Documentation: Original or period-inspired recipes for brews, spirits, teas, or coffees, including detailed instructions and ingredient sourcing.

## Construction

- Building: Crafting structures, huts, shelters, or other large-scale creations.
- Weapon Crafting: Creating period or fantasy-inspired weapons, including swords, axes, and bows.
- Armoring: Crafting armor, shields, or protective gear.

- Woodworking: Making furniture, tools, or decorative wooden items.
- Metalworking: Creating metal items, including tools, jewelry, or decorative pieces.
- Stonework: Carving, shaping, or building with stone materials.
- Leatherworking: Crafting leather goods such as belts, pouches, or accessories.

## Cooking

- Baking: Crafting bread, pastries, cakes, and other baked goods.
- Fermentation: Making fermented foods and beverages, such as sauerkraut, kimchi, or yogurt.
- Period Recipes: Cooking dishes inspired by historical or fantasy traditions, with attention to authentic methods and ingredients.
- Preservation: Techniques for preserving food, such as pickling, canning, or curing.
- Roasting & Grilling: Cooking meat, vegetables, or fish over an open flame or in an oven.
- Specialty & Exotic Dishes: Creating unique or exotic dishes that fit the world of the

Legend, such as magical or rare ingredients.

- Stews & Soups: Preparing hearty soups, broths, and stews, often with period ingredients.

## Costuming

- Ensemble Assembly & Kit: Putting together complete outfits, ensuring all pieces (garb, accessories, etc.) work together to form a cohesive look.
- Fantasy Race Costuming: Creating costumes inspired by fantasy races, such as elves, dwarves, orcs, and other fantastical beings.
- Garb Creation: Designing and crafting period or fantasy-inspired clothing, including dresses, tunics, and robes.
- Textiles & Fabrication: Working with fabrics to create period-accurate textures and patterns, including dyeing, embroidery, or weaving.
- Wig & Hair Styling: Styling and creating period or fantasy-inspired wigs, beards, or hairpieces.

## Sculpture

- Stone Carving: Crafting sculptures or reliefs from stone or similar materials.
- Wood Carving: Shaping and carving wood to create statues, figures, or decorative pieces.
- Clay & Ceramic Sculpture: Creating sculptures from clay, including pottery, figurines, or decorative pieces.
- Metal Sculpture: Crafting sculptures from metal, including welded or forged pieces.
- Found Object Sculpture: Using repurposed or found materials to create artistic sculptures.
- Miniatures: Creating small-scale sculptures, often used in gaming, display, or as detailed representations of larger works.
- Mixed Media Sculpture: Combining different materials or media to create three-dimensional art.

## Storytelling

- Animation: Crafting animated stories, whether 2D, 3D, or stop-motion.
- Digital Art: Creating visual stories through digital mediums, such as graphic design or digital illustrations.
- Dioramas & Models: Constructing detailed models or dioramas to visually represent scenes or stories.
- Photography: Capturing moments or narratives through the lens, telling stories visually.
- Oral Storytelling: Traditional spoken word storytelling, from myths to personal tales.
- Recordings: Creating and sharing audio or video recordings that tell a narrative or capture performances.
- Videography: Creating and editing video content that tells a narrative or story.

## Writing

- Creative Writing: Crafting original fiction, poetry, and other imaginative narratives.
- Diaries & Journals: Writing personal reflections or records, often used for character

development or immersive roleplay.

- Fan Fiction: Writing stories based on established characters, worlds, or universes.
- Historical Writing: Crafting narratives or content based on historical events or settings.
- Letters & Correspondence: Writing letters or communication pieces that contribute to character-building or worldbuilding.
- Roleplay Writing: Creating in-character narratives or exchanges within a roleplaying context.
- Scripts & Screenplays: Writing dialogue-driven content, such as plays, skits, or screenplays.
- Worldbuilding: Creating detailed settings, rules, and lore for a fictional world.
